Judy Madigan, President, welcomed everyone; she then explained the Board changes (covered in last month's newsletter and email). The changes will become permanent at the elections in November.


An exciting bit of news was shared ~ 4 of our members have been accepted into the CPSA International Exhibition: Linda Bishop, Hanneke Jevons, Julie Karner, and Gary Dyak !!

Jo Ann Eurell introduced **Liz Monaco**, today's presenter. Liz has been part of Chapter 117 since the beginning as a charter member; she has been a popular and respected colored pencil instructor; however, Liz also teaches drawing and other art fundamentals, and has also taught at Flagler College, known for its excellence in art education. She is a graduate of the Art Institute of Philadelphia, and further attended the Philadelphia College of Art and Moore College of Art.

Liz has been an award-winning artist many times over, to include multiple showings at the St. Augustine Art Association. Her love of colored pencil began after taking a class with **Bill Shoemaker** many years ago. Recently, Liz has added Colored Pencil Batik to her repertoire, a creative and exciting technique.

Liz then gave her presentation on "Using Water-Soluble Inktense Pencils." She uses both Derwent Inktense pencils and Derwent Inktense Blocks, and emphasized the importance of making your own color reference sheet with each color; it is difficult to always know what the result will be just looking at the pencil. Liz also shared some of the surfaces that she uses, such as pastel mat and Fabriano watercolor hot press. Other highlights included, wet-on-wet, blocking in, palette-to-paper, pigment-to-paper, blooming, rough and smooth palettes, adding dry pencil, and other techniques. The *images* that follow show a bit of what was covered. The demonstrations made using watercolor pencils, especially Inktense, approachable and exciting.

When an instructor leaves you feeling that the medium and techniques are within your reach and mastery ~ that is success. *Thank you, Liz Monaco!* for another incredible presentation.



Background can be blurred, blocking it in saves time!













- Parrott using Inktense and Prismacolor
- Fabriano w/c, tape down or will buckle
- Blocking and blurring in the background
- Blooming on the body
- Add details, beak, eyes, other
- Add dry pencil, bring together for final result
- Add more water and color as needed, creates more blooms







Creating a blooming effect starting with wet paper. And adding some splatters. Let go!

Color remains intense, no fading. Manipulate only when wet ~ cannot reactivate. Working on mylar?: working with water, not solvent. **Gary** says no, but will work on Yupo paper. **Sofia** asks can you use masking? Yes, can use Frisket of other types, very helpful.

> Something new that Liz is working on! The eyes are Inktense, the rest is pencil.



Prospectus

- 1. This is a show for chapter members only; there is no fee to enter.
- 2. This is a dual show in-person at the local gallery and online.
- 3. Five submissions per member are permitted; the show will not be judged.
- 4. The gallery has a limitation of approximately 50 pieces to hang. The artist must indicate the priority of each piece to be hung if not all entries can be accommodated; however, all entries will be displayed online.
- 5. Registration will open September 1 and go through October 14, 2023.
- Submit your registration at <u>cpsal17staug@gmail.com</u>. Include the following: your name, title of each entry, the dimensions (include the frame if local), and sale amount or indicate NFS (not for sale), and a photo.
- 7. Photos must be submitted not larger than 5 Mb and without any framing in the photo.
- 8. Works must have been completed in the last 5 years and be either:

A) 100% colored pencil on a manufacturer-prepared surface per the CPSA National International exhibition specifications, OR

B) follow the "Explore This" specifications where the piece is <u>predominantly</u> colored pencil, but includes another medium (ink, pastel, w/c, etc.), collage, artist prepared surface, 3D surfaces, or any other technique, surface, or element that is not allowed for the CPSA International exhibitions.

- Works that will be hung in the gallery must have a securely attached wire (not the alligator clips); also, please ensure your piece/matting is securely affixed to the frame.
- The opening reception will be held on Sunday, October 29, 2023, from 1:00 to 3:00 PM. The drop off at the gallery is Wednesday, October 25 at 5:00 PM. Pick up will be Sunday, December 10 (time TBD).
