## **Congratulations, Gail Clements!**

Many thanks to our judge, John Robak, who wrote the following appraisal:

"I chose, for the 2023 challenge winner, the drawing by Gail Clements. It has a strong composition, a dramatic use of complementary colors, and an effective use of contour lines. The placement of the plant center and the butterfly pull the viewer back into the composition, counteracting the outward movement of the leaves. The bold complementary colors create depth, and the red and white on the insect's wings integrate it to the scene. Lastly, contour lines and dramatic light allow the viewer to understand the shapes and movement of the leaves. Well done."



Gail commented that "The reference photo was taken in the Butterfly Conservancy in Key West. I just love butterflies and when it landed on that plant I had to take that picture It was really challenging for me, especially the green leaves. After agonizing over it a long time, I was pretty happy with the result."

### **Enlarging Reference Photos & Artist Trading Cards**

This was a dual presentation by **Jo Ann Eurell** and **Kathi Darby**.

Jo Ann led off with a Powerpoint presentation on how to enlarge reference photos. There are many options for doing this. **PosteRazor** is a popular tool that can be downloaded or used online. Takes a raster image and cuts it into pieces; then you can print out and reassemble for a larger image. This app is free!

There other software is available (see the list below). Popular ones besides the *PosteRazor* is *Topaz Labs Gigapixel 7 with AI* (top choice), *Adobe Photoshop*, and *A Sharper Scaling*. It is strongly recommended that you listen to the recording for all the detailed comments.

The use of AI generated images is now a concern for CPSA, with their use prohibited in the International Exhibition. But, this is different from using an AI program to enlarge photos. CPSA has not made any further comment as yet.

For Café uploads, keeping the longest side to 1920 pixels will keep the image under the 5Mb limit.

Jo Ann went online to go deeper into **PosteRazor**, a 5-step process. First, load an input image; then pick the output paper format; define the tiling (overlapping amount, usually .25-inch) to aid piecing the image together; then launch a PDF app and save; finally, print.

**Adobe Photoshop** was covered next. The standard way to enlarge is to go to Image, Image Size, will show the image inches or pixel dimensions (can change to the 1920 side size). Then resample, where you can pick various algorithms. For the demo, Jo Ann picked 36-inches wide; however, the file size becomes quite large (or play with the resolution).

Jo Ann went on to discuss the AI issue as it affects original works. Using *Firefly*, she asked for images of a Shetland Sheep dog on a beach to generate a reference photo. Four images came up, placing a dog picture on a beach background. Now you can do different effects: color or monochromatic, change the lighting, perspective, and so on. Art effects included various paints, watercolor, pen and ink, etc. The regenerated image will come up in the chosen effect. The image becomes similar to a drawing. Also, someone can take an artist's image and then manipulated for their personal use.































## **Enlarging Reference Photos & Artist Trading Cards**

Kathi Darby introduced the very fun and popular activity of artist trading cards. These are original works in small scale and meant to be given away, just for the pure joy of it!

Kathi explained the "rules" for the trading cards:

- The size is 2 1/2-inches by 3 1/2-inches.
- Can be portrait or landscape.
- Must be traded, not sold.
- The back will have the title, artist signature & printed, medium,

The practice started in 1917, when a Swiss artist created 1200 of them for a display in a museum. He then invited people to come and trade with him.; and it took off from there.

If artists do sell their cards, they are called Art Cards, or ACEO (Art Cards Editions and Originals). There are online swaps, can be digital, but it's more fun to have the real thing. There is a requirement that it fit into an official trading card sleeve.

However, the work does not have to be a card; they can be poster board, wood, tile, quilted, lace, fabric, but must be the right size. Can be painted, pencil, mixed media, etc.

Kathi used a rooster card as an example, first in the original size, then enlarged to show the detail.

Where to get the cards, Amazon, Jerry's Artorama, Dick Blick, Ampersand, Crescent, and more. Strathmore 300-Series is very popular, vellum or smooth. Prices range from \$2 to \$5 dollars for 20 of them. You can also go to Hobby Lobby of Michaels and get place cards, very inexpensive.

Why do the cards? They can serve as a way to work out details, composition layout, color, etc. The images can be realistic, abstract, or Zentangle. There are websites with vintage cards, some mixed media, photos. Kathi showed many examples of styles beside vintage, to include modern images (paints, ink, collage), fine art with florals, landscapes (with a lot of detail), whimsy, animals, and so on.


