

Abstract on Birch Wood

Learn how to create beautiful depth in shadows with an abstract design. There are many advantages to working on this unique surface.



Crystal on Black Paper

Give dramatic effects to your drawing by using black paper. Learn the secret to getting your colors to pop!



Skyscapes on Mi Tientes Touch

Color blends easily with a stroke of your brush! The toned sandpaper surface grabs the color and solvent will smooth out the texture.





Metallic Objects

Drawing metallic objects are interesting because of the reflections. Learn how to break it down into shapes. Learn how the paper you choose makes a huge difference in the level of difficulty. Choose from silver metal on grey paper or gold metal on white.

Review: Jesse Lane Workshop

Two of our members, Judy Madigan and John Guiseppi, attended the September 28-29 Jesse Lane portrait workshop, "*Dynamic Skin Tones*," in Myrtle Beach, SC. As you can see from the photo's below, the focus was very specific and exacting. Here is **John's** review:

"The first day started off with introductions. We were each provided a booklet, and a contour drawing of Jesse's piece entitled "Riptide". This would be the portrait that we would work on for the remainder of the workshop.

Jesse went over a few specifics and his philosophy on skin tones. He highlighted each of the following topics; Burnishing, Contrast of Value, Contrast of Color, and Variety. Jesse says that his skin tones now number 86 plus colors and are still growing." Like splotches of color on an autumn leaf, skin tone is organic".

Jesse works in areas, larger to smaller and moving from general to specific details. He teaches that almost anything you render can be broken down into 3 steps, value, color and texture.

At this point we started working on the pupil of the eye. We started off using 9 colors, and I'm sure we added a few more along the way. It's a very slow process, consisting of much layering until the area is burnished and perfectly blended. It amazed me at how smooth and painterly the final result was.

We spent most of the first day just working on one eye. Jesse is very thorough, explaining each step meticulously and often will go around checking each person, of-fering tips suggestions and compliments.

Day two consisted of working on hair, skin tones, lips and using the X-Acto or Slice ceramic cutter. The Slice was used to add single line details by scratching a very thin line of color from the painting. We ended the workshop with learning to do water droplets.

Each area that we worked started with the darkest color in the area to establish value. We consistently worked from general, to specific, ending in a burnished smooth transitioned area.

If you get a chance to attend one of Jesse's workshops, I highly recommend it. Jesse is very polite, easy to talk with, and a wealth of knowledge in his specialty, portraits."

Review: Jesse Lane Workshop


And Judy's feedback:

I agree wholeheartedly with the review John G. wrote. I found Jesse to be both personable and laid-back in his demeanor, yet precise and exacting in his work.

In his workshop, he uses a camera and monitor system so you can see exactly what he is doing. He works the piece, and you work along with him. He tells you what color, stroke, and pressure to use as you follow along.

For those who tend to work fast, his pacing, especially on the first day, may become tedious, but the detail of the focal point (the eye) is absolutely necessary to achieve the dynamic and dramatic effects of his paintings.

Jesse does look to the class for input on his pacing and will adjust to meet the needs and desires of the class. All in all, I would highly recommend his workshop to anyone looking to achieve dynamism and drama in their work.



The 20+ page booklet that you see was included with the class.

Stop the presses !!! A double win at the FCAL "Fall Show" on October 13th




