April Meeting Recap

Linda Doup, President, welcomed our guests from other chapters and CPPG ~ including **Bonnie Haney** from Rochester and a past workshop presenter here in Palm Coast. Linda also introduced Board members present.

The July 2021 Chapter sponsored workshop with **Mark Menendez** will be open for **member** registration on **May 1 through May 15**. Then registration will be open to all. The dates again are **July 16, 17, and 18** (Fri, Sat, Sun). Day 1 is a *color study*. Days 2 and 3 will be *portraits*. You may take both or just one of the offerings. **Color/Friday:** \$70 member, \$80 non-member. **Portraits/Sat-Sun:** \$100 member; \$125 non-member.

Liz Monaco gave an overview of her May meeting presentation ~ **Reflections** on **Toned Paper**. You can use Strathmore 400 toned or Canson gray papers.

Pat presented the March scratchboard submissions (<u>click here</u>).

For the program, and monthly challenge, **Kathy Viehe** (subtraction award-winner, "**Bosley**") gave a fascinating presentation on the art of **Subtraction** ~ along with her able assistant, **Hanneke Jevons** (also an award-winning subtraction artist). Both acknowledged the influence of Tracy Frein, a pioneer in the subtraction medium. And both treated us to examples of their own work. As the demonstration progressed, there were many questions and comments.

This was a truly memorable program ~ many thanks to both *Kathy and Han-neke*. We were all reminded to complete our own pieces to enter before next month's program!

Challenge Note: As before, everyone is invited to either submit a photo of your work or you can hold it up during the meeting. Both ways count as a submission for the monthly challenge. The one rule is your submission must have been done during and/or after the Chapter meeting (no previously done work). Entry must be submitted the Saturday before the Chapter meeting. Completing each challenge this year makes you eligible for a drawing for a prize (to be determined). But, more importantly, it will serve to strengthen your own skill set as you move forward with your colored pencil endeavors.











Tips:

- 1. Use matte film, Grafix Dura-Lar .005, taped to white paper or foam core.
- 2. Cover film with Art Stix (now discontinued) or black Prismacolor pencil.
- 3. Lightly spray with OMS (odorless mineral spirits), Turpenoid, Gamsol, etc. Lightly dry brush to blend; dry for several hours.
- 4. Place reference photo below and lightly trace with a Tombow eraser. Transfer paper does not work!
- 5. As usual, do the eyes first.
- 6. Can use the back side to enhance penciled detail.
- 7. Work the lightest light, then darkest dark.
- 8. Use a value finder. Use Magic erasers for the brightest white area.
- 9. Use pencil to fill in or correct.
- 10. Use kneaded eraser to slowly lighten an area; then Tombow for detail; and Verithins for details.
- 11. Can use blending stump or chamois. Use a 3" brush to clean.
- 12. Not necessary to spray at finish.



- 9 x 12 Strathmore toned gray medium surface (400 series) paper Hobby Lobby and Michaels have it by the pad.
- Transfer paper
- Pencil

Please transfer the image to paper before class. Trace the outlines of the full-size (5" x 11") photograph on the next page.

- · Tombow mono zero or equivalent eraser; or a battery eraser with a smaller eraser tip
- Faber Castell pencil eraser (Like the old typewriter erasers) Optional
