
Flagler County Sheriff's Office K-9 Portrait Project

September Meeting Recap

Judy Madigan, President, welcomed everyone (to DC117 Palm Coast!) and introduced the Board members. There was a reminder that membership renewals are underway. Be sure to renew with CPSA at \$50 (a slight increase) and the chapter remains at \$20. Also, anyone who joined after May 1st is covered through 2024. Be sure to update any contact information.

There is a members-only exibit at Expressions Gallery opening October 29, but also online. The registration is open until **October 14**.

The CPSA Explore This online exhibition is now open for entries. This category is predominantly colored pencil, but can include other media. The Chapter is researching workshops for members.

Judy discussed the Flagler County Sheriff's Office K-9 portrait project and invited everyone to participate. There is no end date at this time and multiple people can do the same dog. There are stock photos of 7 dogs. This could be expanded to other law enforcement departments.

The Chapter also needs to create a new "Palm Coast" image, as was done before with Bridge of Lions. A suitable image is being explored.

The program was then turned over to Jo Ann Eurell.


Jo Ann, as noted in the announcement, spent the summer experimenting with different techniques using colored pencil on fabric. As we know, Jo Ann knows fabrics, being a well-known quilter and lace maker artist and instructor.

The presentation covered the following topics:

- Which colored pencils work best on fabric
- Which fabrics accept colored pencil
- How do you stabilize fabric to prevent shifting
- How are aloe vera gel and textile mediums used
- How wash-fast are colored pencils

Jo Ann first shared a Powerpoint "**Colored Pencil on Fabric**." Jo Ann first got into colored pencils originally because she wanted to know more about color. First she tried Pigma Micron pen as an outline for Prismacolor pencils. The results were great, but this technique would not hold up well for washable clothing. She also enhanced a quilt piece with the Pigma Micron to add detail. Then Jo Ann experimented with adding coloring to an embroidery piece.

The pencils used included Prismacolor, Derwent, Caran d'Ache, Holbein, and Faber-Castell products, including water-soluble pencils. Here is an example of the first test on fabric with a simple application and trying to blend. What seemed to work best were the Prismacolor and the Holbeins.




Pencils chosen to investigate purther

- Prismacolor Premiere apportable
- Holbein buttery smooth application
- Derwent Inktense used a lot on fabric & intense color
- Caran d'Ache Museum Aquarelle intense color

Jo Ann explained what fabrics she uses and why stabilization is important. She uses mostly Kona 100% cotton (prepared for dyeing). The surface must be secured and stable to use the pencils without moving; fusible interfacing, freezer paper, Mod Podge, and medium tear-away were covered; the freezer paper seemed to be the best option.

Agents to activate and control pigments were covered, including nothing, water, fabric mediums, and aloe vera. The methods used to draw were dry-on-dry, wet-on-dry, and wet/dry-on-wet.




Results - after Medium was added


Jo Ann then heat set, dried, the washed the samples:

Washed - Prismacolor



Washed - Holbein





Jo Ann determined that using an Icarus Board or adding solvents such as Meltz did not prevent bleeding, or aid in blending, and both washed away. She tried using embroidery as an outline, then adding pencil with water or extenders; both the Caran d'Ache palette and palette with wells were used. Also tried was a Derwent Outliner Pencil, non-water-soluble pencil, less bleed.

Some intensity was lost when the embroidery test was washed; Inktense did very well. Jo Ann tried using the Caran d"Ache rough side of the palette, with water, which blended smoothly but had to remix often; washed very well. Using a palette well did not do as well, consistent color but much less intensity.



Jo Ann did extensive testing with types of muslins. Also tried design taped to the back of each type of fabric and tracing with Frixion pen (which disappears when

heated). She found that using unbleached muslin with Inktense was great.

In summary, Jo Ann found that Holbein worked best and would use a textile medium. And definitely not wash the piece!

Test and Practice is a must; test the fabric first,

then test your colors by making a color swatch. This is very different from other pencil techniques. Use a dull pencil and a color activator or textile medium.

Summary

- For Inktense pencils:
 - Unbleached muslin (dry-on-dry followed by water only) is my first choice.
 - Excellent blending, stayed inside the lines, fine lines could be added.
 - the Caran d'Ache palette method is my choice on a jabric other than muslin.
 - Allowed use of the 100 colors of pencils, but quantity was small.
- For Inktense blocks, mixing in a painter's palette well with extender was my first choice.

• Allowed use of blocks instead of wood pencil and quantity was larger.

• Extender helped control pigment spread.

Unbleached Muslin fabric

This fabric came from my stash. I'm uncertain where I purchased the muslin, but good quality muslin can be found at most quilting stores. Buy a small quantity and test it with Inktense.



Jo Ann went on to do some quick demos of the applications that she tested.



Unbleached muslin and white Kona cotton


Coloring in the block with a dull Derwent Inktense Bright Blue





Applying water on the Kona, and it runs.

Five different types of unbleached muslin with Inktense ... all worked very well.



Using the Caran d'Ache rough palette side, apply the pencil to the palette. Then use water and apply, will not take off and bleed, especially for Kona Cotton.





You can mix other colors on the palette to obtain different hues and blends Here is purple added to the blue. But you must keep working quickly while it's wet as it will dry.






The session ended with a discussion about suitability of colored pencil on fabric for CPSA International submissions as well as Explore This. It was felt that an unaltered fabric surface should qualify, especially for Explore This.

- 1. This is a show for chapter members only; there is no fee to enter.
- 2. This is a dual show in-person at the local gallery and online.
- 3. Five submissions per member are permitted; the show will not be judged.
- 4. The gallery has a limitation of approximately 50 pieces to hang. The artist must indicate the priority of each piece to be hung if not all entries can be accommodated; however, all entries will be displayed online.
- 5. Registration will open September 1 and go through October 14, 2023.
- Submit your registration at <u>cpsa117palmcoast@gmail.com</u>. Include the following: your name, title of each entry, the dimensions (include the frame if local), and sale amount or indicate NFS (not for sale), and a photo.
- 7. Photos must be submitted not larger than 5 Mb and without any framing in the photo.
- 8. Works must have been completed in the last **5 years** and be either:

A) 100% colored pencil on a manufacturer-prepared surface per the CPSA National International exhibition specifications, **OR**

B) follow the "Explore This" specifications where the piece is <u>predominantly</u> colored pencil, but includes another medium (ink, pastel, w/c, etc.), collage, artist prepared surface, 3D surfaces, or any other technique, surface, or element that is not allowed for the CPSA International exhibitions.

- 9. Works that will be hung in the gallery must have a securely attached wire (not the alligator clips); also, please ensure your piece/matting is securely affixed to the frame.
- The opening reception will be held on Sunday, October 29, 2023, from 1:00 to 3:00 PM. The drop off at the gallery is Wednesday, October 25 at 5:00 PM. Pick up will be Sunday, December 10 (time TBD).
