Robert Sena is our guest artist for October. Robert explains his topic of Tree Bark in the following quote: "In grade school we are often 'taught' that trees have green leaves and brown trunks. But that is an oversimplification."

In a heavily shaded forest, the trees may appear to have "brown" trunks, but in good daylight, where most of our best natural subjects are photographed, the tree trunks and branches are more varied than that.

Here in Florida, the oaks, cypress, and pines are a few of the primary trees we will find in parks, preserves, etc. And each of these trees have colors, textures and marking making them very different. Understanding this difference will help the artist to create more realistic environments for their subjects."

On that note, the challenge entries for the last two months were shown; there are some incredible pieces demonstrating that these skill studies are important for all of us.

Diane Dumas is stepping down as President of the CPPG, with **Mary Tougas** taking over. On behalf of the Chapter, AJ acknowledged all that **Diane** has done to promote the interaction between our two groups. We have all benefited so much from getting to know our fellow pencil artists at The Villages and have become real friends. Many thanks, Diane.

Of course, there was a reminder for Chapter members to renew their memberships by the October 31 deadline.

From there, we turned our attention to **Kathi Darby**, a favorite local instructor here in Palm Coast ~ and of course over Zoom!!

How many of us think about the technicalities of drawing hair? What Kathi demonstrated was a revelation for sure. We started with an overview of key attributes of human hair, then proceeded to the hand's on demo of dark and light tresses. Always know your light source, including on the part if any; hair is in "chunks & clumps"; draw in the direction the hair is going, usually from root to tip; be aware of the movement of the hair; and properly place the highlights and shadows.







Hair ~ Overview

















Overview

- 1. Consider the light source
- 2. Hair is in chunks and clumps
- 3. Hair with texture
- 4. Mark the highlights
- 5. Shadows between the highlights
- 6. Each clump has a shadow
- 7. Go dark in shadows, but still see strands
- 8. Draw bottom up for shadows
- 9. Tumbling hair, follow movement
- 10. Filling in the missing top

- 11. Curley hair, find the highlights, no part, strands different on each side, different movement
- 12. Minimal drawing on this side
- 13. Wide part, major strands first, then wisps
- 14. Use eraser to create highlights
- 15. Looks complicated, but take your time, work each part

- Hair: Dark & Straight
- 1. **Espresso** strands come to a point
- 2. Reserve highlights
- 3. **Espresso** shadows
- 4. Leave room between strands on other side
- 5. **Terra Cotta** (warms up Espresso), leave space for highlights
- 6. **Dark Umber** define chunks both sides

Hair: Dark & Straight continued

- 7. Cream on highlights to warm up
- 8. Bangs curve, some sharp strands
- 9. Redefine for straight hair with movement

Hair: Light & Wavy



Hair: Light & Wavy

- 1. **Chocolate**, work with major strands first. Bring to a point. Follow the lines around. Tighter waves means curlier hair.
- 2. Work the minor strands
- 3. **Light Umber**, put shadows in the curves
- 4. **White**, highlights on center of each strand
- 5. Then Cream over White
- 6. **Burnt Ochre**, above and below the highlights (can also use Terra Cotta, Henna, or Sienna)
- 7. Beige on background strands
- 8. **Terra Cotta** on one side to give shadows depth
- 9. **Dark Umber** to redefine shadows, including background strands

Hair: Light & Wavy continued

- 10. Leap of faith ~ **Light Umber** fly-away curly hairs
- 11. Then Beige
- 12. **Chocolate**, random, don't distract from main curls
- 13. Fly-aways on main curls, don't go over background curls
- 14. Goldenrod or Yellow Ochre to tie strands together; use light strokes down the strand, connect the highlights
- 15. **Terra Cotta** to warm up shadows
- 16. **Dark Umber** or **Expresso** to deepen shadows
- Burnish with Cream or Beige; use Q-Tip heavy pressure along strands
- 18. Gamsol, apply with Q-Tip
- 19. Can continue to redefine with **Cream** and **Goldenrod**
- 20. Strands in black & white
- 21. Gamsol used on dark hair sample


"A teacher's writing lesson turns into a whimsical learning experience for her classroom of students. The children discover a

Everything is online, so no shipping—or framing for that matter—is needed. If your artwork is juried into the exhibition, it appears on the CPSA website indefinitely starting February 1, 2022. Plus, your work can be for sale or not for sale, and if someone buys your work, there is no commission to pay.

- > <u>Download the Explore This! 18 prospectus</u>. (Includes complete instructions on using the CaFÉ website.) **Be sure to read the prospectus thoroughly**. Entries close November 15, 2021. Don't wait until the last minute!
- > Go to the CaFÉ website to enter. Note: you will be asked to log in or set up an account. Then just follow the steps to enter.

And then there's the prize money!

Last year, \$2,000 went to the Best of Show and \$1,500 to the second place winner. In all, 13 artists shared \$8,835 in cash and product awards.

Your CPX signature status or merit award awaits you, too.

Three acceptances in a 10-year period earns your CPX status, with merit awards given at five-acceptance intervals. **Note:** Dues must be <u>paid for 2022</u> for acceptance in this show to count toward CPX signature status.
