## Just A Friendly Reminder ...

In a Nutshell, the dates for TTP publishing has changed (June, 2020, p6) as well as renewal dates.

## FYI: CPSA National Finding Ways to Enhance the Zoom Experience

Hello Chapter President,

I hope that this message finds you well and attending to life in the best way possible given our restrictions. None of us really know how long this current situation is going to last, so we may have to prepare for several options as we walk into the future.

Jan Fagan, president of DC 207-Seattle had a great idea: Many chapters have implemented ZOOM or other platforms to continue to stay connected with members for chapter meetings and presentations until they can meet in person. Some of those chapters have tech-savvy members that already have a set-up with overhead cameras, lighting, etc. to conduct presentations, demonstrations or workshops and for a nominal fee have provided presentations for their chapters. Other chapters are struggling to find programs or presentations.

There are CPSA members that not only have the technical set-up but also have the knowledge and expertise to teach colored pencil workshops. We would like to propose that individual chapters notify their members of the need and have them self-identify themselves through the chapter Facebook page; other chapter presidents looking for programs could "shop" there. It's perfectly fine for the presenter to charge a fee: that's standard and acceptable practice when you do a demonstration virtually or in person. The "fair market value" rule applies, whether you're buying goods or services.

As chapters identify which members are ready and able to present, the chapter president could also make mention of that availability on the Chapter Presidents Facebook page. Those chapters without Facebook pages could ask for assistance to post an announcement on the Chapter Presidents Facebook page. There may also be some other tools or apps that may be helpful for how chapter members and other chapters can communicate regarding this topic and others; be on the look-out for Marjorie Diephouse's article in the November issue of <u>To The Point</u> magazine entitled "Get Creative with Your Creative Business".

# 28th annual international colored pencil exhibition

The Colored Pencil Society of America (CPSA) opened its 28th annual CPSA International Exhibition online at <a href="https://bit.lv/3gVJqxF">bit.lv/3gVJqxF</a>. This is the premier exhibition and competition dedicated to the use of colored pencil as a fine art medium. This year's exhibition is online due to the cancellation of the planned gallery show in Dunedin, Florida, following the COVID-19 pandemic. It will remain viewable through August 2021.

Hanneke Jevons, a member of the society's St. Augustine chapter, achieved Signature Status, an honor granted to color pencil artists who have been selected for three international exhibitions. Jevons is an artist, photographer and retired art teacher.

The exhibition attracted 780 entries from artists in eight countries from which juror Chris Valle, professor of art and design at the University of Tampa, selected 125 pieces. From those, 14 award winners received a total of over \$16,000 in prize monies. The \$5,000 Best of Show and CIPPY Award went to "Undercurrents" by Jesse Lane of Texas.

The 29th annual CPSA International Exhibition and Convention is scheduled to take place in Cincinnati next year.

Founded in 1990, the Colored Pencil Society of America is a nonprofit organization for colored pencil enthusiasts worldwide, working to promote colored pencil as a fine art medium by sponsoring exhibitions and workshops, being involved in product research, and educating the public in general.



This year's international juried event received close to 900 entries, of which 113 were selected! I'm thrilled to be among them once again!


I'm not at liberty at this time to say which piece. But the publication is scheduled for release early this spring."

## **How to Join Our Zoom Meetings**

## Before the meeting:

- 1. For best results, please use the Chrome web browser and a computer with a built-in camera. However, if you have a webcam that will work too.
- 2. Prior to the meeting, download and install the FREE Zoom app here:
  - . (CTRL+click) will open the app.

There are several choices. Pick the first one, "Zoom Client for Meetings":



An install window will appear:





3. A start up window will open. Just to try it out, click on "**New Meeting**" – if your camera is working, you will see yourself. In the lower left-hand corner of the Zoom window, you will see "Mute" and "Stop Video." Make sure there is not a red slash mark (/) through these icons. If there is, simply click once and the audio and/or camera will start working.



4. Relax and wait for the meeting day. Watch your email for your invitation to the meeting.


Save the email: this invite will have the link you'll need to join the meeting. Depending on your email service, it will look something like this:




You will click on the link in the email – "Join Zoom Meeting"

When this window opens, click on "Open Zoom Meetings":




Yes, you want to click "Join with Computer Audio":



On the meeting day, the host will be ready to let you in. At that point, make sure your camera is on (just like you practiced in step 3 above).




## On the morning of our meeting:

Go to your computer and follow these steps:

Click on the meeting link in the email invitation. This will launch the Zoom app.

When system dialog prompts, click **Open Zoom Meetings**:



Follow the prompts on the page that appear. There are two prompts: one to join with video and one to join with audio. Select Video, Audio "ON" (the host can Mute all participants during the session to avoid outside noises from disrupting the meeting.)

Be sure that the volume on your computer is turned up so you can hear and so people can hear you.

In the upper right-hand corner, you can choose to see one of two views: "Speaker Only" or "**Gallery**" (preferred), which allows you to see everyone. In Gallery mode, a yellow frame will appear around the person talking. You'll also be able to see yourself.

Now, enjoy the meeting and say hello to your fellow Chapter members!
