November 17th Meeting: Photoshop ~ No Fear!

We all take photos for our colored pencil pieces and for personal pleasure. Photo editing software seems so complex and scary to many of us. For some, it just seems too technical with too many menu options.

Fear not! **Joanne Eurell** will take the fright out of photo editing with a demonstration of **Adobe Photoshop**. We will learn the basics of editing a photo ~ cropping, exposure, image sizing, layering, and so much more.

Professional photographers can go quite deep into all the features of this and other photo editing applications, but the every day user can very easily learn some of the essential options that will really enhance their photos and be a pleasurable experience. For example, every photo that you see in these newsletters is run through Photoshop, especially to crop and adjust the lighting.

October Recap ~ Icarus!



Before we get to the program, we first celebrated Hanneke Jevon's birthday with a surprise cake! Best wishes from all of us.

Our meeting room was set up with several Icarus Board stations for members to try out. But, first **Bill Shoemaker** gave us a great overview of this handy tool which he uses regularly.

The Icarus line of products was invented by Ester Roi, and artist and inventor. According to the literature, the basic principle is that when a wax-based medium is exposed to heat, it becomes softer and melts. But, off the heat the medium quickly solidifies.

There are 3 models, the Icarus Drawing Board (in two sizes) and the Icarus Painting Board (the largest).

The Drawing Boards have a warm zone and cool zone so you can move your piece back and forth. These are designed for the table top, working horizontally.

The Painting Board is designed to use vertically, on an easel. The entire surface is a warm zone.

You can check out the information and examples on the Icarus website: icarusart.net. "The Icarus Boards are just a tool; they won't teach you how to draw, but they will add a new and exciting dimension to your drawing experience."

Bill proceeded to explain how he uses the board and to show us examples of his work. It certainly makes backgrounds much easier and faster to complete. But it is also useful in many other ways: skin tones, liquid effects, translucent effects, etc.

The boards work best with wax-based colored pencils, colored pencil sticks, water-

soluble and water-resistant wax crayons and wax pastels; and oil pastels.

There is a wide variety of surfaces that can be used: drawing, watercolor, and pastel paper; illustration boards; fabric, glass, and more.

Bill demonstrated some tools that he uses, for example, "color shapers" which have silicon tips and can move and blend the medium. Paper stumps can also be used.

Bill then invited everyone to try the Boards and tools for themselves. *Thank you, Bill*, for a wonderful hands-on Chapter meeting!

Pat Lentine gave an update on the CPSA National

Convention in Brea, CA. For those of us who have never been able to attend a convention, her description really got us psyched up for this year in Tampa. *Thank you, Pat,* for the update and for representing our Chapter.

After some general announcements by, we proceeded to **Show & Share.** Thank you to **Hanneke Jevons**, **Helene Alland**, **Becky Busch**, **Joyce Houck**, **and Pat Lentine** for sharing their artwork; we learn so much from this sharing. 




Member Profile ~ Meet Judy Madigan

Beware the Scammers



Sadly, CPSA National as well as one of our own Board members have been hacked by a scammer. The attack is believed to have come via a CPSA national email. Part of the scam is the attempt to get you to buy a gift card.

But, besides that, our member had her email compromised which required many hours with her provider to fix and resolve.

It is important to remember that on group emails you should use the BCC option so that multiple email addresses are protected.

And, of course, never fall for the gift card scam, buying online or by phone. You will be asked for the PIN. Also, be aware that Facebook is not secure and is often the gateway to scams.

Below is the warning email from CPSA National. 'Tis the season to be jolly ~ but unfortunately it's also the season to get scammed.

Dear chapter colleagues,

We have recently learned that a financial scam was directed against the board members of one of our CPSA district chapters. We want to make sure you are all aware and are on guard against any future scams of this kind. PLEASE SHARE THIS EMAIL WITH ALL YOUR CHAPTER MEMBERS. We have no way of knowing who will be the target of the next attempt.

In this case, we think the scammer was able to contact the chapter's board members directly because their personal email addresses were available from the chapter's website. The scammer — who used this email: pres-clubs@clubmembers.com — sent an email to each board member pretending to be the chapter president. The board members were each instructed to purchase six \$100 eBay or GooglePlay gift cards (claiming they were to be donated to a veterans' hospice), scratch the back of each card to access the PIN number, and then send the PIN numbers either to the scammer, by replying to the email he was using, or to another fake email — vhcw@ts-kc.com — identified as "Veterans' Hospice Palliative Care" (but actually the scammer). Last, the board members were assured that the chapter president, whose signature ("FirstName LastName, President") was at the bottom of the email, would "be liable" for reimbursing the board members.

Next time it may be different amounts, different types of gift cards, a different charity identified as the recipient, or different emails to which the PIN numbers are to be sent, but the basic scam will be the same: someone you think you know, but probably using an email you've never seen before, will ask you to buy gift cards and send them the PIN numbers and will promise to pay you back.

How do you protect yourself? Here are a few rules.

- 1. Never buy gift cards just because someone else asks you to. Gift cards are the most frequently used currency for scams like this. And no one you actually know will ever ask you to send them the PIN numbers. Really.
- 2. Ask yourself whether this is something the chapter board or president ever discussed the chapter doing. Does it sound at all likely? If you're not sure, call the president directly and ask, before you do anything else. Your very best defense is a healthy skepticism.
- 3. Always check the sender's email. In this case, it's visible and an obvious fake. If it's not visible, roll your mouse over the link that is the sender's name and see what it says.
- 4. Never make your personal email addresses available on your chapter website. Use the official chapter email forwarder (location-dc999@cpsa.org) that has been created for you. Or set up a "contact us" link that opens a secure page that people can use to reach the chapter. Corporate image director CJ Worlein (image@cpsa.org) can help you with that.
- 5. And just as a general rule, never click on any links in suspicious or unsolicited emails. Never never never. No cute or funny video or photo is worth the anguish of the damage that malicious software can do to your computer. Again, when in doubt, check with the person who is the purported sender before you do anything else.

The bottom line: If someone's asking you to send them money, or anything that equals money (gift cards, PIN numbers, account numbers, Western Union transfers, MoneyGrams, etc.) ALWAYS assume it's a scam until you reach the real and actual person you think it is to confirm that the request is legitimate. Sad to say, it probably won't be. This is just the world we live in.

If you are teaching a class or workshop, please let us know so we can include it next time. Also, if you know of workshops that would be of interest to the membership, send along the information.


