

April 2024 Chapter Meeting

Judy Madigan, President, welcomed everyone and introduced the Board members. It was announced that **Peter Kushner** would be sharing information about a 2025 colored pencil cruise at the end of the meeting; he covered possible cruise lines, pricing, instructors and a travel agent website to be published. (Click here for the official flyer). Judy also mentioned the logo search due to the chapter name change; everyone is invited to submit ideas and/or artwork.

Pat Lentine announced the topic for the **May** meeting ~ who or what inspires you; perhaps a person, place, color, photo, and so on. The premise is to have a conversation, to make personal connections, and to share. Be sure to bring samples or items if possible. The **June** meeting will feature **Hanneke Jevons** and painting your own pet, focusing on the eyes, taking a photo, making the line drawing, and getting started.

AJ then introduced out presenter, Linda Metzger. Linda is such a treasure to be part of our chapter. Linda will share how she came to colored pencil, from



somewhat of a novice to award status just since 2022. She started as a graphic artist, had a full family life and career in physical therapy, then returning full time to drawing. Since then, Linda has been recognized internationally, was selected for Ann Kullberg's "Colors", cover art for "The New Barker" and "CP Magic" to name just of few of her accomplishments. What follows is a brief synopsis of her presentation with just a few images.

Linda began her presentation stating how she was encouraged to do art in early childhood. In college, Oakland University, Rochester, MI, she was further encouraged by her father and art paid for some of her schooling. Linda went on to become a physical therapist, which she absolutely loved, including missionary work in Macau, near Hong Kong. Upon returning, Linda earned her Master's degree at the University of Florida, specializing in neurological disfunction. Then, she stopped drawing for 20 years. In 2001, she suffered a brainstem aneurism, making physical therapy difficult. She then shifted gears, with a son with special needs, worked in education. Then back to physical therapy.

In 2019, she shifted gears. After a bicycling accident, Linda started to draw

again. Now she focused on free-hand drawing of pets. COVID and its protocol set in and Linda started to draw pet portraits, forgoing PT altogether. At this time, Linda was doing graphite and entered into a relationship with Bonny Snowdon. By June, Linda set up a 2020--Pandemic Strikes: practice and "freebies"



website and went into business.

Graphite development continued during 2021, playing with light and subtraction techniques. By 2022, Linda took a foundation course with Bonny Snowdon.

2023 was an indescribable year. She was asked to speak at an artist's guild; then lost a nephew in March; was an SAA finalist in May with "Out of the Water;" in August they lost their youngest son at 28 years old; she went on to London with

the encouragement of family. There Linda was able to spend an extended time with Bonny Snowdon. But, during this trip, Joshua was lost. Doing art was hard, but she found hope with teaching kids. CP Magazine awarded Linda with an Honorable Mention. And more honors continued to come her way.



2023 Works in CP



As Linda stated, 2024 continues to be a time of growing and healing. She has been invited to do the cover art and as the featured artist for two publications. Linda also takes pride in one of her students, Jaxon, a 12-year-old, being a finalist in the UN World Wildlife Day 2024.



Linda pointed out the flamingo drawing, which she is entering in to the CPSA Exhibition, called "Positively Glowing" looking into the light. Linda draws strength from a Helen Keller quote, "Keep your face to the sunshine and you cannot see a shadow." After a very challenging year, Linda is keeping her face to the sunshine

and the flamingo drawing is helping her to do that. Her message is to find your joy through your art. Linda then went on to the second part of the presentation with a discussion of materials that she prefers, particularly Pastelmat and a selection of pencils. A brief summary of her discussion is below. She also shared where she draws and a few favorite tools.

Part Two: Materials and Process

#1) SURFACE: Clairefontaine Pastelmat

• What is Pastelmat? A cellulose based acid-free deep-toothed velvety paper for use with pastels and colored pencils. Available in pads and sheets (170 lb.) and board (applied to 1.8 mm foamboard).



#2) PENCILS

- Lightfastness—a major concern for me due to commissions
- Faber-Castell Polychromos—made in Germany. \$156/set of 120
- Derwent Lightfast—made in the UK. \$251/set of 100
- Caran de Ache Pablos—made in Switzerland. \$237/set of 120
- Prismacolor Premiere—made in Mexico. \$160/set of 150
- Misc: 22 Luminence; 8 Prismacolor Premiere; 3 Derwent Drawing; 1 white Museum Aquarelle; Grizaye Burnisher Blender.





Next, Linda displayed a step-by-step of her process to draw the Cinnamon Teal duck, "Out of the Water." She commented on the materials, layering, shadows, and composition.

Part 3 of the presentation started with a video of the demonstration as pencil is so slow. Linda chose the fur tail of a Basenji, using Polychromos pencils and always drawing in the direction of the fur. Her advice? Be brave, just draw. The portion covered in the video actually took 25 minutes to record (but accelerated for the presentation), demonstrating the time it takes to properly apply color and layer.





At the conclusion of the video, Linda switched to a live demonstration, finishing the fur tail sample. As Linda drew, those in attendance asked questions. Topics covered the use of a grisaille blender, paper stumps (not preferred), Oyster and other colors to blend (grays, blues), drafting film (not her favorite), kneaded erasers are her favorite, recent production problems with Pastelmat, how much drawing pressure depends on the subject.

The subject won't pop off the page without using lights and darks effectively. For whiskers, takes a very sharp white Polychromos and uses it almost like an embossing tool; the whiskers easily show up when color is applied on top.. It's important to get enough layers for her detail work ~ light over dark.



Recommendation on resources for beginners: Bonny Snowdon Academy, Mark Menendez, Ann Kullberg, Pat Lentine, John Middick/Sharpened Artist, Lydia Steves (Cindy Harrison), Jesse Lane (mini workshops),

Drawing animals is meaningful as Linda brings comfort to her clients who loved their pets so much. Peanut, the cat, is a work in progress. Linda has a thriving commission based business. She discussed how she handles pricing, how much time she puts into each piece, and expectations. If she has 3 months of commissions, then she will raise her prices. She belongs to Petworks for distribution, but most of her clients come from her local area.



Linda uses a workable fixative on her graphite pieces, but not on colored pencil. Pastelmat grabs the color, making fixative unnecessary. She will get 15 or more layers on the Pastelmat. A Slice tool is not needed if you use a sharp pencil. She will keep working the lights/darks to make the piece come alive.

This 3-part presentation was so comprehensive and informative; we will be thinking on all the content for a long time to come. **Many thanks to Linda Metzger** for sharing such an intimate journey with us.
