



Colored Pencil on Stipple Paper

Stipple paper is a drawing paper with an irregular pebble texture. When colored pencil is drawn over the surface, a shading effect similar to stippling is revealed. In its commercial heyday (ca. 1896 – 1955) it was used to create black and white illustrations for newspapers and magazines in a fraction of the time (and \$economy) of hand stippling in pen and ink.

In our **Draw Along**, we'll work in full color and then heighten the work in places with pastel dust: the combination makes the work glow!
